## ***The December Show Special Guest - Jeanette Wormald***

Jeanette Wormald is one of a new breed of singer/songwriters who can reflect what it's like to be Australian without having to draw upon the stereotypes which have characterised so much of this music in the past.

Born in Adelaide in South Australia, then raised in the small rural community of Mount Compass, her music reflects all the elements of living on the land. The hot sun, the wide blue sky, the hard bush life and our often-unacknowledged Aboriginal heritage.

In her teens Jeanette moved to Adelaide and later pursued a career in journalism for some years, travelling widely. However, music and a rural life eventually prevailed when she married a farmer and moved to a farm in low rainfall country known as the Northern Mallee several hundred kilometres from Adelaide. The Mallee is a drought-resistant eucalyptus tree and could also be a symbol of the characters of Australian men and women who farm much of the semi-arid farmlands of South Australia. Indeed, the Mallee environment became the catalyst for the writing of a number of Jeanette's well-known songs.

In recent years Jeanette's career has blossomed, thanks to regular touring and the production of a number of highly acclaimed recordings which have shown the Australian music industry that hers is a unique talent: an ability to write great songs but also a special affinity with audiences

of all ages when she presents her show-stopping concerts with just a guitar, a swag of stories, and bell-clear songs that enthrall everyone who listens.

Although Jeanette now enjoys national and state recognition of her talent, and widespread national and international airplay, her career has only just begun.

Some words Jeanette sent recently for our show.

"We will be performing songs from my new album Opal Blue. All three of my single radio releases in the past 18 months have now been hits. Opal Blue enters the charts this week (Saturday November 18) at number 29. Boundary Rider's Daughter reached number 4 this year and charted for 16 weeks and the single, If This Isn't Country, which is a bonus track on the new album, reached number 12 last year and charted for 12 weeks.

I was a finalist in the CMAA Achiever awards for Independent Entertainer of the Year.

I will be performing with Lord T / Pete Titchener."



## ***The December Show Special Guest - Bob Magor Bush Poet***



Bob Magor left school at 15 years of age, then spent about 25 years working his sheep and cattle farm in South Australia. At the age of "about 40" he decided to follow his sons who announced they wanted to pursue a career "off the land".

Bob began putting his rural experience to use by writing bush

verse and poetry and has now written the listed below.

The first of his works was released at the Tamworth Country Music festivals of the early 1990s, and he has gone from strength to strength since that time.

His books include Blasted Crows, Blood on the Board, Caravanning Bliss, Donkey Derby, and Snakes Alive and The FMG.

His latest book (2005) is "The Exodus".

Do and Goggle on his name and many hits will result, mainly locations where his books can be purchased from.

The webmaster has a complete set of his books, they are wonderful, but to hear the author recite them is better still! CDs are now available, so one can listen to the wonderful

way Bob recites his works. Books and CDs will be available at our December meeting, make sure you bring some money!

Among other things, they play Cajun French Button Accordions, Frottoir (*pronounced 'frott-waah'*) also known as the Zydeco Rub-board, Piano accordion, Keyboard, Guitars, Mandolin, Banjo, Harp and even a Didgeridoo!

Their on-stage high-jinks and the unique blend of instruments make for a terrific musical treat for everyone. A highly 'visual' act, they love to 'keep the fun in the music', sometimes even joining folks on the dance floor as they play.

With forward bookings until late 2007, the cowboyZ are now looking forward to the release of a 'live' CD/DVD combo in the next few months featuring recordings and

### LEN WAKEFIELD MEMORIAL FUND

Subject to certain conditions, the purpose of the fund is to assist younger talent with proven ability: a) in entering talent quests throughout Sth Aust, Mildura and Tamworth, b) by payment or part payment of professional tuition, and c) towards the cost of a musical instrument. The fund is administered by the ACMC committee with expenditure limited to the interest from capital invested, with all payments made to the appropriate body and NOT to the awardee. Annually an awardee is chosen at an event deemed suitable by the Full Committee by a judging panel consisting of three suitably qualified ACMC committee members. Contributions to the fund, which may be made to the club treasurer at any time will be acknowledged in the club newsletter.
