Darryl Eckert: Bass/rhythm/lead guitars, harmonies and vocals, Darryl's career has spanned many years – beginning with Kevin Bergen at the age of 8

Martin Krollig: Standing in for young Bradley Bergen, who's gone to Tamworth, Martin plays drums and does vocals. He began playing in rock bands in the 60's and switched to country in the early 90's

Kelly is an international performer with a love for country and country rock, She has over ten albums to her credit and has featured on several other compilations.

LEN WAKEFIELD MEMORIAL FUND

Subject to certain conditions, the purpose of the fund is to assist younger talent with proven ability: a) in entering talent quests throughout Sth Aust, Mildura and Tamworth, b) by payment or part payment of professional tuition, and c) towards the cost of a musical instrument. The fund is administered by the APMC committee with expenditure limited to the interest from capital invested, with all payments made to the appropriate body and NOT to the awardee. Annually an awardee is chosen at an event deemed suitable by the Full Committee by a judging panel consisting of three suitably qualified APMC committee members. Contributions to the fund, which may be made to the club treasurer at any time will be acknowledged in the club newsletter.

Don't forget - First in ... First sat!!!

The committee had an interesting discussion about this matter and came to the following conclusion. Any member or visitor who has paid to come into the show has the right to sit in any seat that has not already been paid for.

For a couple of months we tried a system of prepaying for seats so that people could save seats for their friends. The system hasn't worked – it's been too hard to manage, so we are not doing it any more. But the rule hasn't changed!!
