The April Show

Peter Coad and the Coad Sisters

Peter Coad is a Bush Poet, Balladeer and Songwriter of Australiana gathered from a life devoted to touring and performing to audiences throughout Australia.

Every year Peter Coad travels some 80,000 kms and performs in more than a hundred venues to very appreciative ears!!! When not touring, Peter keeps busy writing and recording new material for his live shows and albums. A finalist in 1998 at the Tamworth Golden Gumleaf Awards, category best album, with his Peter Coad presents "Bush Verse" CD. Also a finalist in two categories at Tamworth's writers Song writers Awards in 1994.

Originally from Hawker in the Flinders Ranges, in the north of South Australia, for the last ten years has resided at Bundanoon in the NSW Southern Highlands.

In 1990 Peter Coad was joined by his two sisters, Virginia and Lynette, and the show became Peter Coad and The Coad Sisters. The Coad Sisters, very fine musicians, playing guitars, fiddle, mandolin, harmonica, keyboards, drums, with very distinctive harmonies and clear strong vocals soon became well known, popular and successful in the club scene and their tour venues.

Virginia Coad was Star Maker Grand Finalist at Tamworth's search for a Star quest.

Virginia and Lynette are talented song writers as well.

They too live at Bundanoon in the Southern Highlands of NSW.

Bernie and the Bandits

Bernie and The Bandits have been playing their own unique style of County Music now for two decades.

Bernie "the Bandit" Scott was born and bred in a little town on the Fleurieu Peninsula called Yankalilla, where he first began drumming at the age of nine with his father in an old time dance band. He moved on to rock bands in the late 60's and 70's, then began playing solo with his Hammond organ, progressing on to bass guitar in his earlier Country bands, taking up lead guitar in the late 80's.

In recent years, Bernie has a fine ear for musical instruments, being able to play almost anything he picks up, including clarinet and saxophone.

Patsy Croucher became a "Bandit", initially playing acoustic guitar, progressing onto bass guitar, vocals and vocal harmonies in 1994. She is a talented, published songwriter. Bernie and Patsy double up as the popular duo "The Recliners"

David Cross is the "Bandits'" keyboard player. Although noted as a bass guitarist, his keyboard talents remained a bit of a secret until discovered. David is also a talented singer with beautiful harmonies

Ben Elliott heads up the percussion section of the band on drums. Both David and Bert from Strathalbyn joined Bernie and Patsy in 2002.

The "Bandits" are a fun band who go all out to make audiences enjoy their shows as much as they do!

Report from your Publicity Officer

February and March offered a number of Country Music Events to check out. Your publicity officer attended a number of them, including the Blue Lake City Muster, Lake Charlegrark Country Music Marathon, Barham Country Music Stampede, Frances Folk Gathering and the Eyre Toyota Western Country music festival (at Port Lincoln).

The **Blue Lake City Festival** at Mount Gambier featured Bella (the award winning trio of Karen O’Shea, Lyn Bowtell and Kate Ballantyne), Carter and Carter, Lee Forster and the Furrabreds, Allan Webster and Leah Briggs, workshops, a cabaret and a Talent Quest. Neither the cabaret nor the Saturday night concert was very well attended. It was cold and damp (dew) on the Saturday evening, but all put on a great show. Bella had to have a substitute guitarist and managed to get Rod McCormack! (He of course is multi golden guitar producer and lucky spouse of Gina Jeffreys). The winners of the female and male vocal sections (Tiffney Stroh and Stewart James) also performed. Our locals alone made the evening worthwhile. Lee is well know to a number of locals, he was in a group with Brendan Beleski in Kalgoorlie and grew up close to Anthony Stewart and Tracy Sherrah (nee Stewart). Lee is a 2001 Australian Country Music College graduate and has been a finalist in many events.

One young lady that we have not seen at our club for a long time entered the talent contest. She was Natasha Higgins! Natasha teamed with Candy Latham to win the Open Duet section. She came second in the Female vocal section. The full results are on www.saccm.com.

The following weekend was spent at **Lake Charlegrark**, only 30k or so East of Frances in Victoria. The name is misleading. The lake was low last year, but completely empty this year. It made a good spot for a local pilot to land his aircraft this year! I stayed over for the Monday to sort out my pictures and give the organizers them on a couple CDs, plus catch up on a few other things. I was going to stick around the area until the Frances Folk Gathering the following weekend. Others from SA had gone over to **Barham**, NSW for the CM Stampede, so I joined Frank Baker, Bill Bates and Betty plus Allan Waite and Betty Squires there too! The drive was only five or six hours.



The Arapilies (South of Horsham) looked magnificent in the morning sun. I had ridden my bicycle in that area a number of years ago, so it was interesting to see them again. There is a Caravan Park beside the Murray River next door to the venue so was very convenient to stay at, even if I had to settle for an unpowered site. The weather was very hot but fortunately the venue was all inside the Services Club and fully air conditioned, it was too cold if anything! Because I was a day or two late arriving, and left early I missed a few artists, but caught most. There were many 'jam sessions' going on in various places from the Pub, in Marquees, under trees, under the stars etc! The music was of a very high quality. There were many workshops, Blackboard concerts, competitions, art displays, bush dances, poetry sessions etc. There was even a Traditional Tibetan Cook up! There were also a number of stalls selling CDs, hand crafted Banjos, trinkets, jewellery and food etc. There was plenty of liquid refreshment available in the Frances Hotel and other stalls. There is a great website full of information and pictures of past events (www.francesfolkgather.com.au). Two of the features were the Saturday night "Bandemonium" and Sunday's "Musos Mixed Grill! 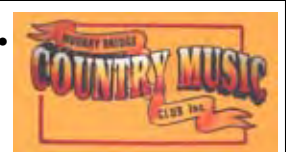
