The Oct Show Tricia Wilson & Midnight Mountain Blue

Tricia Wilson has had a passion for singing country music since the age of 12 and began her professional singing career at the tender age of 15. In 1983 Tricia won the SA Great Country Music Awards and as a result, went to Tamworth to represent South Australia in the Australasian Country Music Titles. Tricia achieved a very creditable 'runner up' in the Best Female Vocalist competition.

Since this time Tricia has appeared throughout Australia and travelled extensively interstate. She has appeared with many well known country music identities such as Jimmy Little, Ted Egan, Reg Lindsay, Craig Giles, Felicity, The Beggs Brothers and Barry Thornton, her most exciting achievement was the opening act for the Rock Trio Cotton, Burns and Morris at Adelaide Festival Theatre in 2001.

In 1998 Tricia's most creditable recognition was being the featured artist on ABC Radio's Friday Night Live in Concert across Australia, In 2001 Tricia appeared on channel 7's AM Adelaide and with the overall response was asked back on several occasions.

Tricia has built up a considerable personal following, earning a reputation as the "Little Lady with the Big Voice", and once you hear her sing you will be left in no doubt as to why.

Midnight Mountain Blue have been playing together for 18 years and have appeared with Tricia throughout this period. The band has earned a reputation for outstanding musicianship and has won awards in its own right including "Best Band Award" at the 'SA Great' Country Music Festival.

Tricia and Midnight Mountain Blue have headlined many country music festivals throughout SA, NT and NSW. Their most recent achievement was being chosen to support Lee Kernaghan on his 'Australian Pass the hat around' tour.

With a variety of music spanning Country Classics, Country Rock and good old Rock and Roll, the band know they have a song for every taste in music.

In 2006 Trish Wilson was inducted into the **South Australian Country Music Hall of Fame at Barmera.**

The Oct Show Guest Artist Dwayne Elix

DWAYNE Elix has rapidly established himself as one of the next big stars on the Australian country music scene. And it is sheer talent that has seen him snare a swag of credits over recent years. But there was never any doubt that this multi-instrumentalist - vocalist - songwriter would succeed. His background and his determination, as well as his talent, guaranteed it.

Born on a farm in mid-north South Australia in 1965, Dwayne was introduced early to country music as his parents played guitar and sang songs of Tex Morton and the Carter Family. By the time he was 13, Dwayne - named after guitar legend Duane Eddy - was playing

guitar. But such was his music ability that he went to also learn mandolin, dobro, banjo, dulcimer, bass and lap steel.

Gifted with fine, appealing vocals, Dwayne began singing and playing at local concerts. This set him on his chosen career path - country music - and he set about broadening his musical horizons and extending his repertoire to include bluegrass, blues, rockabilly and sniffle.

Then the city beckoned and Dwayne moved to Adelaide. He concentrated on his music each night after work and to soon gaining the plaudits of the public and the industry alike for his singing, his song writing and his instrumental ability.

Keen to gain as much experience as possible, Dwayne formed his own band while at the same time working for others. His talent saw him chosen as the Adelaide support for Keith Glass and US artists Billy Joe Shaver and Steve Young.

In 1985 Dwayne continued his assault on the country music scene with credits to his name - 1985 Best Instrumental, South Australia Great Country Music Awards 1986 Best Songwriter runner-up, SA Country Music Awards 1987 Best Songwriter runner-up, SA Country Music Awards 1987 Best Instrumental runner-up, SA Great Country Music Awards 1987 Best Instrumental runner-up SA Country Music Awards 1987 Best Band Performance, SA Great Country Music Awards.

As he was racking up all these credits, Dwayne was continuing his development as a top all-round performer. His songwriting blossomed, his vocals and instrumentals were placing him in an enviable position with a big following and gaining him recognition as artist with a huge future. 1992 saw Dwayne, now based in Sydney,

reach the finals of the prestigious Star Maker Quest.

A debut single, produced and released in collaboration with some of the top names in the industry - Heather Field, James Gillard, Ian Simpson, Keith Urban - came in 1994. The involvement of such people is testament to Dwayne's talent, and the high regard in which he is held by his peers.

Mallee Blue was formed in 1996 bringing together the talents of Noel Kneebone, Darren Gurney, Brenton Ahrns, Anthony Hodgen and Neil Chapman in a combination that has won numerous awards throughout South Australia, including the Frank Harding Memorial Trophy for Excellence.

In 2005 Noel was inducted into the Rocky Page Hall of Fame at Barmera, he was also awarded the Industry Award by the Adelaide Country Music Club.

Proudly South Australian, this refreshing band specialises in Australian country and contains the song writing talents to present much of their own material, as well as delivering onstage antics that endear them to young and old alike.

Mallee Blue launched their debut CD, "Mallee Blue", in 1998 where it shot to the top of the SAMIA/SAFM South Australian Music charts, the first time ever a Country band has done so!

Mallee Blue is featured on the world released 1999 Compilation CD of South Australian talent.

Mallee Blue received 5 nominations in the 1999 SAMI Awards, including "Most Outstanding CD release" and "Most Outstanding Band". This included all genres!

Mallee Blue is an excellent promotion of Australian Country Rock at its best.

This Original Australian Country Rock band is equally proficient, performing as a special guest in concert style, through to their 4 hour cabaret shows.

The band performs a large range of songs in Country, Contemporary Australian, Country Rock and Old/New Rock and Roll.

Brendan originally came from New Zealand. He worked and sang in Western Australia for a number of years, but has recently moved to Adelaide, SA. He also spent some time at the Gold Coast.

Biography

Moving from the gold fields of Kalgoorlie to Adelaide to further his musical career, Brendan has certainly made the most of the transition by recently winning the 2004 South Australian Country Song of the Year, with 'I'd love you still.'



His debut album 'A Country Singers Dream' written by Brendan, is a reflection of his Time spent in the sometimes hard place of the Western Australian goldfields and the Ups and Downs of everyday life. The album offers superb variation from the feel good Country Rock tune 'All The Right Bumps' to his award winning ballad 'I'd Love You Still'.

Over the years Brendan has played support to some of the big country names such as Don McLean, Lee Kernaghan, James Blundell, to name a few. As a kid growing up Brendan's influences range from a number of artists spanning from the more Traditional artists like Kenny Rogers, and Slim Dusty, to the more upbeat country Artists of today like Garth Brooks and Alan Jackson.
