# April Show:- Camille Te Nahu & Stuié French with John Mathewson Band

## Camille Te Nahu and Stuié French

2006 Australian Independent Duo of the Year.

2006 TIARA Best Duo / Best Female Vocal / Best Instrumental of the Year.

2005 Tasmania & New Zealand Independent Album of the Year.

Camille Te Nahu and Stuart (Stuié) French are widely acknowledged as Australia's premier country music duo. They have just released their second combined album, *Recovered*, a follow-up to their highly acclaimed *Not Without You*, released in 2005.

Both have an enviable track record in the music business. Camille came to live in Australia from New Zealand in 1999, where she was one of the island's favourite daughters. Stuié is one of the top guns in the guitar world, having toured and recorded with some of the best in the business.

Together the combination is nothing short of dynamic, as their numerous awards and accolades will verify.

Camille and Stuié recently won the Mildura Australian Independent Duo of the Year and took out a hat-trick at the 2006 TIARAs for Best Country Duo of the Year with their first #1 chart hit, *Wives Don't Like Old Girlfriends*; Female Vocal of the Year with *Love You Like The Earth* and the Barry Thornton Memorial Instrumental Award with *Ode To Roy And Chet*.

The past few years has been a whirlwind for this hard-working couple, with tours of New Zealand and within Australia; the release of their new video clip, *Let's Make A Family* and prior to this, *Without You*, on the Country Music Channel; an appearance on Channel Nine's

## John Mathewson Band

John spent most of his life in the small Victorian town of Kyabram.

John spent many years involved in sport (mainly football) singing only at parties, barbecues and around the campfire on camping trips before deciding to pursue a career in music.

John's debut album "Forever and Always" was recorded at Birubi Recording Studio in Tongala and was released at Kyabram Club on October 23rd 1992. His second album "It's A Long Road" was recorded at Greenwood Studio in Bendigo in 1994. The title track was co-written by John and Bendigo musician Chris DeAraugo. It was released at Kyabram Bocce Club on December 3rd. 1994.

John has a deep voice (often described as smooth) but can just as easily sing in a higher range. John's repertoire includes songs from old country classics by Jim Reeves, Merle Haggard, Johnny Cash, Marty Robbins, Johnny Horton and Roger Miller, and the more modern country music artists Alan Jackson, George Strait, Randy Travis,

Mornings With Kerri-Anne and so much more.

Audiences have warmly embraced this new album, which is a collection of some of their fans' (and Camille and Stuié's) favourite songs. The second single from the new disc, *All I ever need is you*, is currently the Top 10 and is rapidly becoming a favourite on playlists right around Australia.

Stuié has been recently been producing records for Lee Forster, Matt Manning, Clelia Adams, Jane Saunders, Royden Donoghue and Greg Champion. Never a dull moment in our house!

Our latest single "All I ever Need is You" is currently Number 10 on the Top 30 Country Charts!

John's band "Top Shelf" have become well renowned for their ability as a backing band and have done the backing at many of the major shows at Mildura Country Music Festival for the last ten festivals. They have also done backing on many other concerts, Finley Festival in 1999 and Colac Festival in 2001, Moama Country Carnival 2003, 2004, 2005 and 2006.

John was a judge of the Victorian Champions Of Champions at Mildura in 1998, 1999, 2000, 2001, 2002, 2003, & 2004.

John released his 3<sup>rd</sup> album "Now & Then" at Coomealla Club during Mildura Country Music Festival Sept 2000. One of the songs from the album "Three Rivers Hotel" recorded as a duet with J. R. Williams reached the final five in The Victorian Country Music Awards in February

## Smokey Dawson 1913 - 2008

By now everyone would have heard of the death of Smokey on February 13th. There was wonderful coverage in all media at the time. There is a wealth of information in the internet also.

In the latest issue of latest Capital News, a number of pages are devoted to Smokey. SA's Wally Sparrow's words were even included!

Smokey is survived by his 101 year old widow, Dot.

Below are some words from Tourism Tamworth.

“Born in 1914 (*they got the year wrong!*) in the Victoria town of Warrnambool, Smoky Dawson was Australia's first cowboy. Together, he and his horse Flash were legendary. An entire generation of young Australians grew up listening to his radio show and abiding by his “code of the west”. At its peak, the show was broadcast nationally on 69 stations.

Smoky Dawson rose to prominence after WWII with his radio show The Adventures of Smoky Dawson, which was broadcast around Australia from 1952 until the early 1960s.

He was awarded an MBE in 1978, was admitted to the Australian Record Industry Association Hall of Fame, was elected to Australia's Country Music Roll of Renown, and also received the Honour Award of the Grand Ole Opry and the American Country Music Association in Nashville, Tennessee.”

## Helper sees a new path

THE onset of blindness did not stop Barbara O'Daniel from contributing to the community, she just had to find different ways to do it.

Five years ago, after going partially blind in her left eye, Mrs O'Daniel, 80, was diagnosed with Macular Degeneration.

Despite this, she continued as a Justice of the Peace at the Adelaide Magistrates and Juvenile courts, a job that earned her a Centenary of Federation medal in 2000 for her 22 years of service.

Then, two and a half years ago, Mrs O'Daniel woke up to find she had lost sight in her other eye.

"It was absolutely devastating. But it was also very frightening. Initially, I just didn't want to get out of bed."

She was forced to give up her role in the courts but, determined not to let blindness beat her, Mrs O'Daniel,

of Edwardstown, decided to find a new path for her life. "You can't go backwards, you have to find different ways to go forwards," she said.

She started volunteering at the Royal Society for the Blind (RSB) as a peer support volunteer, offering counselling to others who have lost their sight. The RSB is struggling to attract volunteers, particularly in the southern suburbs.

Mrs O'Daniel urged others to follow her lead. "I get so much pleasure out of helping people."

Mrs O'Daniel is also president of a Weight Watchers group and is involved with Legacy and St John Ambulance.
