I'm 10 years old and I have been singing since March, 2009. My first competition was at the Leafy Sea Dragon Festival in April, 2009 followed by the Barmera Country Music Festival. My success at these festivals won me entry into the 2009 South Australian Champion of Champions, held by the South Australian Council for Country Music. As well as being selected as a grand finalist in the Champs Under 13 section, I was extremely happy and honoured

to be presented with the 2009 Len Wakefield Award from the Adelaide Country Music Club. This is something I am very proud of as it was only my third competition, and I would like to thank those involved with this award for encouraging me to continue singing.



I also want to thank Candy Latham, who has been a wonderful help in providing me with singing lessons, playing guitar for me, helping me to understand country music and encouraging me to enter competitions."

February Show Guest Artist - Allan Webster

Allen recently sent the below:-

“Allan Webster, the 1999 South Australian Champion of Champions of Country Music will be entertaining the members and friends of the Adelaide Country Music Club on Sunday February 7th, when they celebrate their 21st Birthday.

Allan’s musical career spans 45 years, beginning in England as a teenager and playing the typical ‘Mersey sound’ of the time. He migrated to Australia in 1964 and continued his success in several bands over the years. In the mid ‘90’s his interest turned to country music and songwriting and this career move proved to be a very wise one. Allan has become a successful solo country music artist, travelling interstate and overseas where his dynamic stage presence has seen him invited back to venues time after time.

His songwriting prowess is evident by the amount of awards he has won and in 2003 ‘Grandpa’s Words’ won the

SA APRA Song of the year. It was also placed second in the Australian Songwriter’s Association National Awards. In 2005, his song, ‘Love On The Side’ which was recorded by Sandra Humphries on her ‘Every Road’ album, and sung as a duet with Bill Chambers, was awarded a TIARA for vocal collaboration at the Tamworth Country Music Festival.



Allan has released three albums, ‘Joker’s Wild’, ‘Guitar Man’, and his latest album, ‘Part Time Dreamer’ was released in March 2009 and has been selling well with wide radio airplay. His wide repertoire of classic country, bluegrass, Hank Williams and of course his own compositions has made these albums very popular. Take the opportunity to see this great performer in action, along with Trev Warner and ‘Country Junction’.”

February Show Guest Artist - Ian List

Ian has made many appearances at the Club through the years, both with his family and alone.

In 2001 Ian was inducted into Rocky’s Hall of Fame in Barmera.

Ian has been a great promoter of country music in Gawler and South Australian districts since around 1975.

His balladeering singing style in all ranges of country music has become quite legendary in SA.

He originally formed the famous List Family Singers, who have since gone on to form their own bands and sole careers.

Another great pioneer, late Stan Coster, his songs will be sung forever. Reg Lindsay, Tim MacNamare and a few females like the McKean Sisters, Heather and Joy, Jean Shepherd, Joan Ridgeway, The Sneider Sisters, June Holmes and can't forget Shirley Toms died in 1999. Great yodelling songs, the Aussie way from Shirley and June.

Well that's all for now Folks. Let's all enjoy Country Music, no matter if it's folk, bluegrass or a bit rocky or loud!

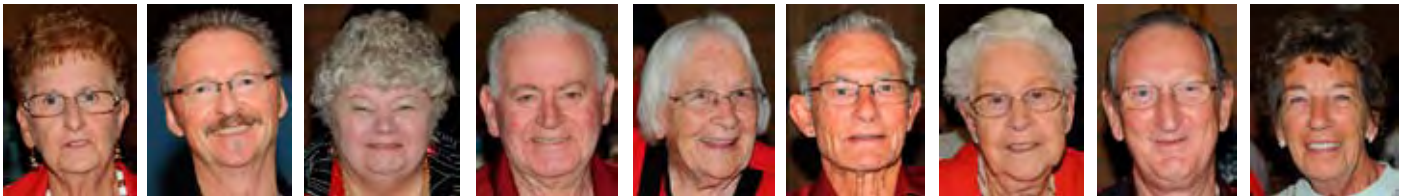

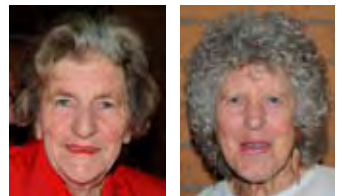

Club Meeting Venue

first show at our current venue, The Slovenian Club, at 11 LaSalle St, Dudley Park.
