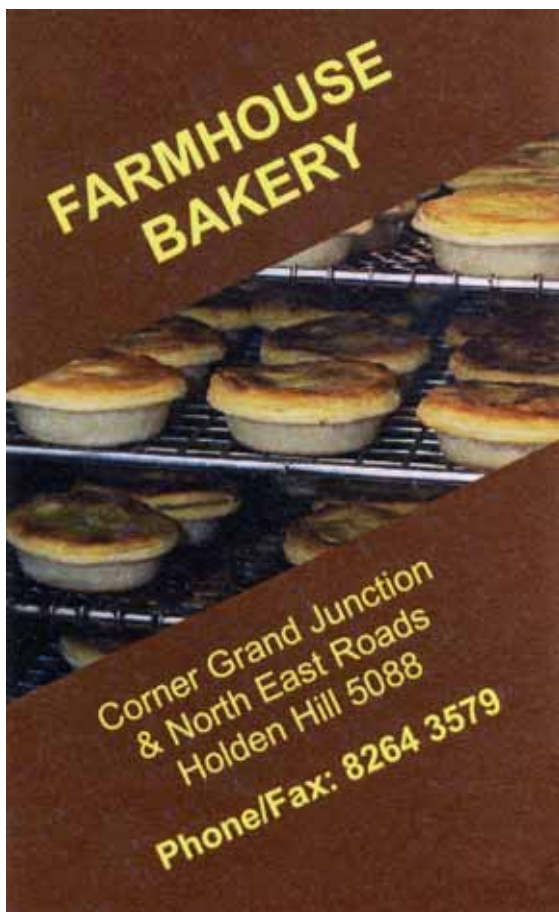
November Show Special Guest Artist:- Don Costa

Vale Frankie Baker

Sadly Frankie passed away on Friday Sept 16th. He was a great supporter of Country Music, particularly in South Australia. He did quite a lot for the ACMC – donated a vacuum cleaner and transported and looked after many of the Bush Balladeers who have come to our club over the years.

He was very generous with his time and money. He donated to many artists to assist them in their careers, e.g. he donated \$100 to Melody Feder to help her get to Norfolk Island this year and many dollars to Taylor Pfeiffer to help in her saving for a drum kit to name just some I know about.. He supported many clubs and radio stations that played country music. In fact he wore membership cards for many them on a lanyard! Some even called him 'tickets'! Some of the tickets I know of were the Adelaide Country Music Club, Country Music SA (formerly the South Australian Council for Country Music), Radio Adelaide (life member), Coast FM and Three D Radio. The Blackwood RSL also benefited from his generosity.

He was always very friendly, talking to anyone who would listen. There were many country music people on his mobile phone contacts! He also made good use of the telephone ringing several radio stations (mainly while they were playing country music) and many of his friends regularly. He rang me from Roxby Downs only a few days before passing away. He was on his way from Birdsville to Marilyn's Country Music Muster in Smoky Bay!

One of his favourite groups was the Royal Flying Doctor Service. He was very involved in their fund raising for many years. I believe they will also benefit from his estate.

Earlier this year he spent quite a few weeks in hospital, but had recovered well and was looking forward to a Country Music Cruise late October.

He promoted many Country Music events by distributing their flyers wherever he went. He promoted the South Australian Council for Music for years, showing them Preludes and encouraging them to join. For many years he has had a 'Frankie Goes a Roving' section in the Prelude

He was lost without his phone. One disappeared a few years ago at the Murraylands Music Festival. It turned up months later in Western Australia. He had put it down on a chair and the owner had folded up the chair and taken it back to WA! The latest phone went missing while Frankie was in Flinders Hospital.

I had a lot to do with Frankie for a decade or so. We attended many of the same Country Music events, even more so for the year he did not have a driver's licence! I received many phone calls through the years! He often turned up at my place for me to download his photos from his camera and email some of them off to various people!

There have been many comments and responses to Frankie's death and funeral on Facebook. Even though he was not on Facebook, many of his friends are.

His funeral on Sept 22nd at Centennial Park, Pasadena was a small one with mainly family, RSL and some close friends attending. Our Club was well represented. His two brothers, Andy and John spoke as did his x-wife. It was interesting to hear more about his life. There should be more words in the October Prelude. The funeral was followed by a reception in the lounge adjacent to the chapel.

There will be a wake for Frankie at the Kilburn RSL, 2 Way Street, Kilburn at 5pm to 11.30pm on Sunday October 30th. Artists and Bands available to play please contact Andy Baker on 0407 716 808. Frankie Baker by his X (Penny Baker)

Frank as we knew him —the intrepid travelling man.

Frank's travelling began at an early age when he sailed from England to Australia with his parents and older brother John.

He hated school and this often left his parents wondering where he was and what trouble he could get in to — he became a typical Aussie larrikin with a heart of gold.

He joined the Navy at 18 to travel the world and as Andy said he was in the engine room or was he really in the brig? One does wonder, where Frankie? Leaving the Navy after having travelled Australia he embarked on his first journey to Europe, Europe was never the same after experiencing Frank, he backpacked through France, Italy, Rome, Spain and all places in between seeing the Eiffel Tower, Colosseum and a mad bull fight, the crown jewels and the tower of London sleeping on the banks of the Thames.

He returned to Australia and worked in the Tasmanian mines to fund his next trip.

India and a swim in the Ganges landed him in hospital but never did he for one minute think of stopping his travels, on to the Taj Mahal with more photos and making friends

along the way.

Japan, the Himalayas, China, Bangkok and Bali the intrepid traveller went, sending great letters back to family of his escapades.

Many years later he sold his house and travelled Australia seeing what this great country had to offer, his interest in country music began with the musicians he met in the caravan parks along the way.

The last 10 years saw him write for the County Music magazines as he travelled from concert to concert in his camper van, meeting old and making new friends along the way, always keeping in touch.

His last trip included the Birdsville races, no winners there! And a light plane trip across Lake Eyre and the surrounding area seeing wild camels, dingoes and the like he was so excited last time I spoke with him not that long ago.

We will, I am sure all miss Frankie's calls telling us where he is and been up to.

He was my husband and lover. I will remember Frank as the man who drove me crazy and was my very best friend.

Len Wakefield Memorial Fund

Subject to certain conditions, the purpose of the fund is to assist younger talent with proven ability: a) in entering talent quests throughout Sth Aust, Mildura and Tamworth, b) by payment or part payment of professional tuition, and c) towards the cost of a musical instrument. The fund is administered by the APMC committee with

Annually an awardee is chosen at an event deemed suitable by the Full Committee by a judging panel consisting of three suitably qualified APMC committee members. Contributions to the fund, which may be made to the club treasurer at any time will be acknowledged in the club newsletter.
